*****Homecoming Dress Up Days: ALL attire must be school appropriate*****

Homecoming is full of activities in which the classes compete for the Homecoming Spirit Award. They may earn points by participating in Dress Up Days, the Womanless Beauty Pageant, Powder Puff Football Games and Cheerleading Contest, Pep Rally, Hallway Competition, and a variety of lunch time activities.

Competitions – Each competition is awarded points toward the Spirit Award. The points are as follows:

1st place = 50 points, 2nd place = 30 points, 3rd place = 20 points, 4th place = 10 points

Nominations for Homecoming King and Queen: September 25th thru September 27th

Monday, October 9th: Womanless Beauty Pageant

- Any high school male is encouraged to participate.
- Clubs, groups, and sports are encouraged to sponsor a contestant.
- Each class should have a male contestant.
- They will be judged on evening gown, bathing suit and talent.
- Applications can be picked up in room 3-02, or printed from the Google Classroom (CODE-lqdkhl).
- Contestants are responsible for their own clothes, makeup, hair, and talent.
- They may bring only **ONE** person (with the purchase of a ticket) with them backstage to help them with the event.
- There will be meetings on **Monday, October 2nd** after school in room 3-02 for all contestants.
- There will be a cash prize for the top 3 contestants with a matching cash prize to their sponsor.
1st place - \$100 2nd place - \$50 3rd place - \$25
- Spirit points will also be awarded based on results of the contestants competing for their classes.
- Tickets to the pageant are \$5 at the door.

Wednesday, October 11th: Powder-puff Football and Cheerleading Competitions

- Each class should have a female powder-puff team and a male cheerleading squad.
- Any class that does not have a cheer squad will lose 100 points.
- Students wishing to participate in either the powder-puff football or cheerleading competition must have a signed permission slip.
- Class officers and sponsors will be responsible for obtaining a coach and players.
- Sponsors and coaches are responsible for keeping all forms and making sure that participating students have turned in their forms **before** they practice or play.
- **Practices may not begin until Monday, September 25th.**
- Sponsors **MUST** supervise all practices.
- A list of eligible players and cheerleaders must be turned in to Ms. Brito by **Monday, October 9th.**
- Cheerleaders will perform between the 2nd and 3rd games.
- If they wish to use music, they must have a **labeled** USB in the press box **before Game #2** (the Sophomore/Junior game). They must also have someone in the box during the performance to start the music.
- Squads must be ready to play/perform when announced.
- Each squad must be in their designated area by the home team benches at the end of game 2.
- Points will be awarded for the powder-puff and cheerleading competition based on set criteria.
- Any inappropriate behavior will result in automatic disqualification of the team and disciplinary action.
- Tickets into the powder-puff games are \$5 at the gate.
- Uniforms are up to the individual teams. All participants must be dressed alike.
- If not using uniforms, ALL cheerleader attire must coordinate and be school appropriate.
- The winner of the cheerleading competition will have the opportunity to perform at the pep rally.

Friday, October 13th: Football Game

Football Game:

- The Homecoming King and Queen will be crowned during half time.
- All court members should plan on attending the Homecoming Dinner at 5:00PM as well as the Game.

Saturday, October 14th: Homecoming Dance

- All Tickets will be on sale in the media center from October 2nd thru October 9th.
- Tickets are \$20 if bought by Monday, October 9th. Tickets go up to \$25 starting Tuesday, October 10th. **NO TICKETS will be sold at the door.** ALL tickets must be purchased in advance.
- Fines and monies owed must be paid before a student will be able to purchase a ticket.
- Homecoming Court will receive complimentary tickets once their fines have been paid.
- Only high school students are permitted at the dance.
- Dates (students) from other high schools must have a completed and approved waiver before a ticket may be purchased.
- Waivers may be picked up and returned to Ms. Brito in room 3-02.
- Waivers must be turned in to be approved by Wednesday, October 11th in the front office. **NO** tickets will be sold until the approved waiver **is turned in.**
- Dress is semi-formal. Jeans and sneakers are not acceptable. Ties are encouraged but not required.
