STEP 3: Make the grade, earn the score....and graduate! The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program is created to establish a lottery-funded scholarship program to reward any Florida high school graduate who merits recognition of high academic achievement. The graduate must enroll in a degree program, certificate program, or applied technology program at an eligible Florida public or private postsecondary education institution.

STEP 4: Know your responsibilities....apply, meet the requirements before graduation & amp; throughout your college career. (Requirements are subject to change with each Florida Legislative session.)

**Dear Senior and Senior Parents:** 

Will you be going to college or vocational school, the military? Start making plans for the ACT and SAT, cap and gown and senior pictures. **Parents**, please make sure your senior has met with his/her guidance counselor and is enrolled in all of **the required classes for graduation**. If your senior is eligible for a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship, check to see if he/she will meet the qualifications for the scholarship. An additional course or SAT/ACT test scores might be needed.

Prestige Portraits by Life Touch is proud to be the official senior photographer for Riverdale High School. They will be taking Portraits for the Class of 2020.

If you wish to place a senior ad in the yearbook, please visit rdh.leeschools.net and click on the Jostens link for Purchasing a Senior Ad. Yearbooks will be available for purchase when school starts and the cost is \$75.00 but prices will increase after December.

One of the first senior activities is **ordering you caps and gowns** and **graduation announcements**. This will take place at the end of October. Details will follow at the beginning of the school year. The payment will be collected in November, with the final deadline for ordering announcements sometime in December. More specific dates will be announced in the fall. The price of the cap and gown increases if ordered after February, 2020. **Announcements cannot be ordered after December**. Announcements will arrive in April and will be distributed as soon as possible. Caps and gowns are distributed in May.

Another fall activity that takes place in November, is the class photo. There will be a **panoramic picture** of the senior class of 2020 taken in the gym, and another panoramic picture of them forming the "20" numbers on the football field. The pictures will be available for \$15.00 each, unless there is a price increase.

Second semester will be lots of fun. There will be a senior class pool party and BBQ (no cost), Grad Bash, which is a special all-night

function for seniors only at Universal Studios. Seniors will ride to Orlando in chartered buses and return the following morning. The estimated cost is around \$160. There will also be a senior breakfast (no cost) and yearbook signing party. Senior activities come to the end with Senior Awards Night, Baccalaureate and Graduation.

Seniors, if you will be attending High-Tech, LAMP, FSW, or FGCU, you will need to keep in contact with the senior class sponsor (Mrs. Gonzalez) to keep current on all of the specific dates of the activities. In the fall, all seniors will be receiving a Senior Timeline of the events and a price list of possible expenditures. The counselors at LAMP and High-Tech will have copies of all of the materials that will be distributed to the seniors. Seniors attending FSW and FGCU will need to stop by the school and pick up that necessary paperwork.

## **SCHOLARSHIPS**

#### **BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP**

The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship
Program establishes lottery-funded
scholarships to reward Florida high school
graduates for high academic achievement.

#### **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

- Be a Florida resident and a U.S. citizen
  or eligible noncitizen, as determined by
  the student's postsecondary institution.
- Complete the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31 after high school graduation.
- Earn a standard Florida high school diploma or its equivalent from a Florida public high school or a registered Florida Department of Education (FDOE) private high school; or complete a home education program.

- Not have been found guilty of, or pled nolo contendere to, a felony charge, unless the student has been granted clemency by the Governor and Cabinet sitting as the Executive Office of Clemency.
- Be accepted by and enroll in a degree or certificate program at an eligible Florida public or independent postsecondary institution.
- Be enrolled for at least 6 non-remedial semester credit hours (or the equivalent in quarter or clock hours) per term.
- If not funded in the academic year immediately following high school graduation, apply within two years of high school graduation to have your award reinstated.

## **SCHOLARSHIPS**

The website (sponsored by the Foundation for Lee County Schools) to apply is

https://flcps.awardspring.com. Students will create an account, complete the general application, and then as a third step, apply to the Fred & Jean Allegretti Scholarship. They may also apply to any other that they qualify for, including the Suncoast Scholarship, Jeff Sommers Memorial Scholarship, and Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship.

- The Fred & Jean Allegretti Scholarship offers a \$1000 scholarship to 5 Riverdale High School seniors. This scholarship is made possible through the generosity of the Fred & Jean Allegretti Foundation.
- The Suncoast Credit Union Foundation has partnered with the Consortium of Florida Education Foundation to award \$116,000 in student scholarships for graduates of the Class of 2020. Suncoast will award \$2,000 scholarships to 58 high school seniors who demonstrate financial need and strong academic performance across the 21 Florida counties we serve.
- The Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship Fund committee wishes to extend to you this opportunity to apply for the Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship valued at \$1,000 to be awarded in the spring of 2020. Richard Hagy had a passion for educating students and served Lee County Schools for more than 30 years as teacher, coach, and principal of ALC and Mariner Middle Schools. He was named Principal of the Year and touched the lives of countless students and friends. This is a one-year scholarship, non-renewable, paid directly to the Financial Aid office of the institution the student is attending.
