
They are 13 years of age or older at the time of account creation.

Full Sail University - Emerging Technology Scholarship

Minimum Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for consideration, those applying for the Emerging Technology Scholarship must:

- Graduate from a Florida high school in 2020 or 2021 (Florida 2020 or 2021 homeschool graduates are eliqible to apply).
- Meet Admissions requirements for an eligible Bachelor of Science degree program (Computer Science, Game Development, Information Technology, Mobile Development, Simulation & Visualization, and Web Design & Development).
- Possess a cumulative high school GPA of 3.8 or higher when the scholarship application is submitted.
- Provide a letter of recommendation from either a teacher or guidance counselor.
- Submit an Application for Admission by November 18, 2019.
- Begin their degree program within the calendar year of their graduation date from high school (for example, a student graduating from high school in May 2020 would have to begin coursework at Full Sail University by December 2020).
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress and adhere to Full Sail University's Code of Conduct.

Six Mile Charter






Last month, the students went to the Salus Care Ropes course for a day focused on team building, leadership, and confronting personal challenges.
