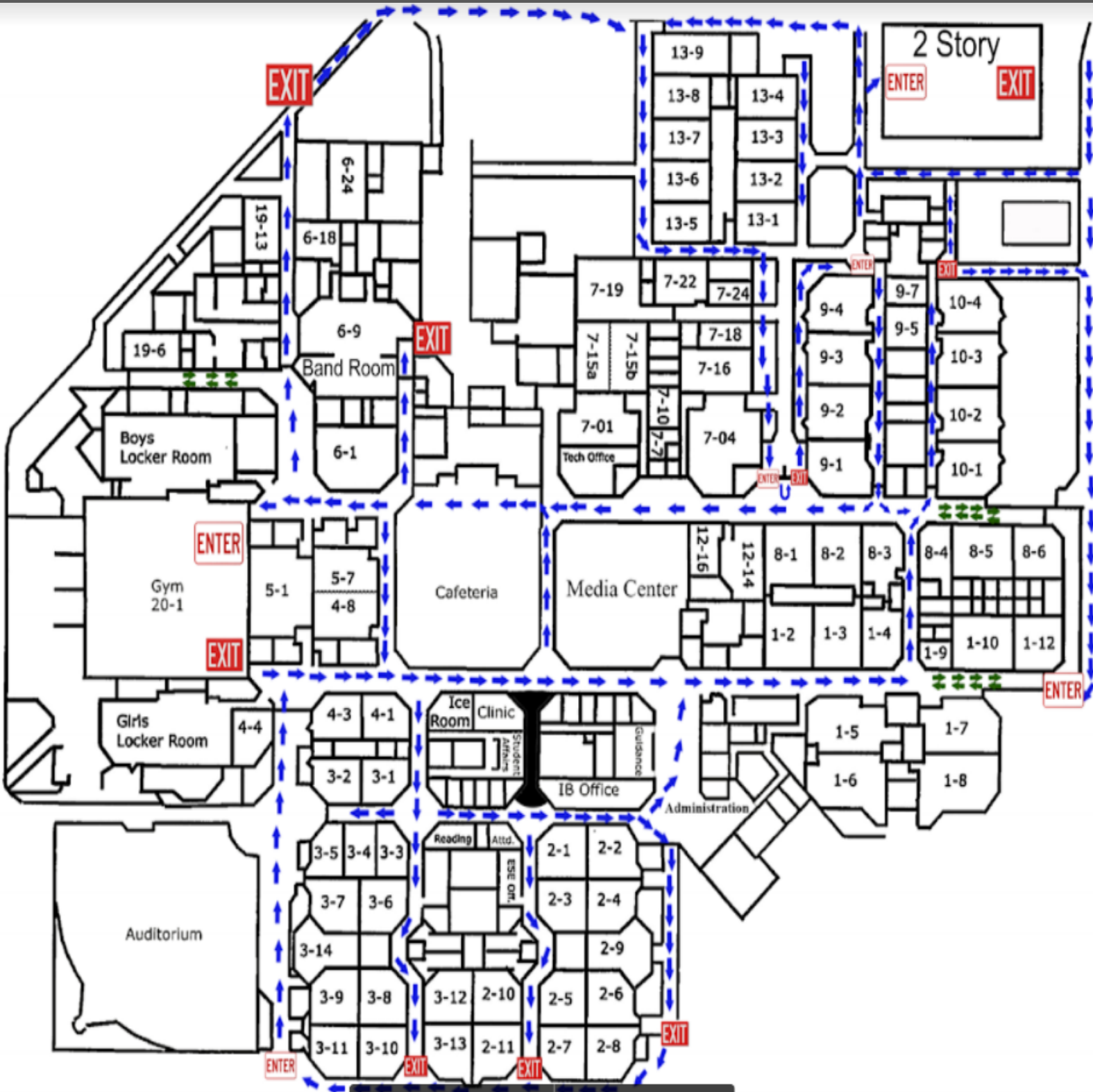
Staggered Arrival:

Staggered Dismissal:

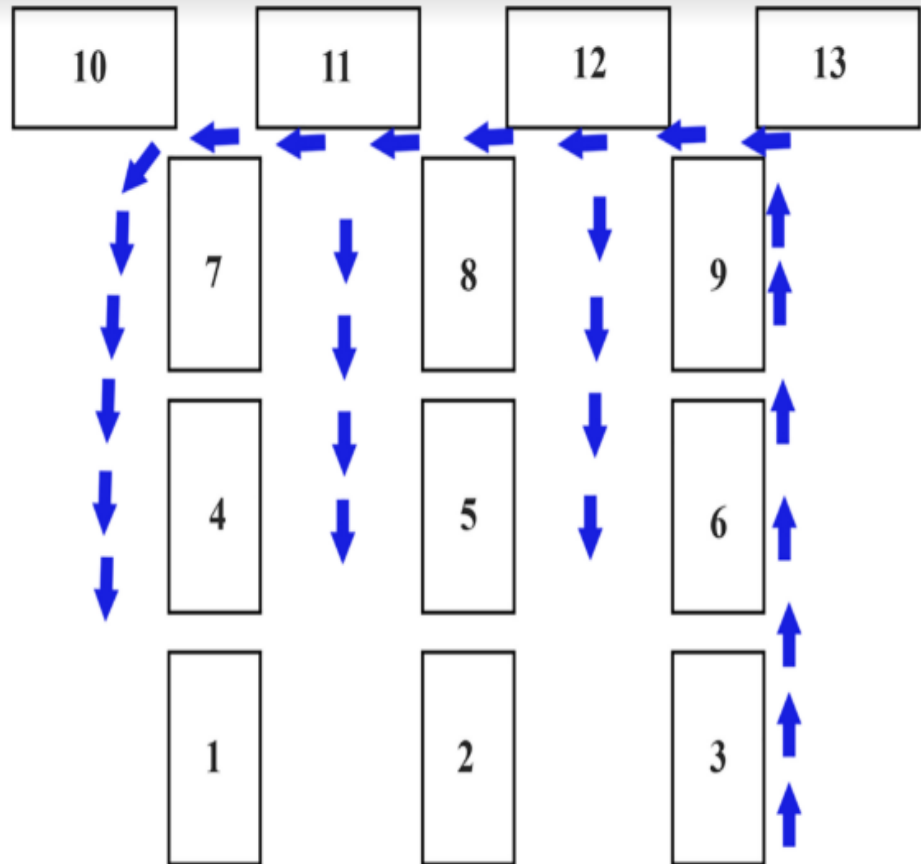

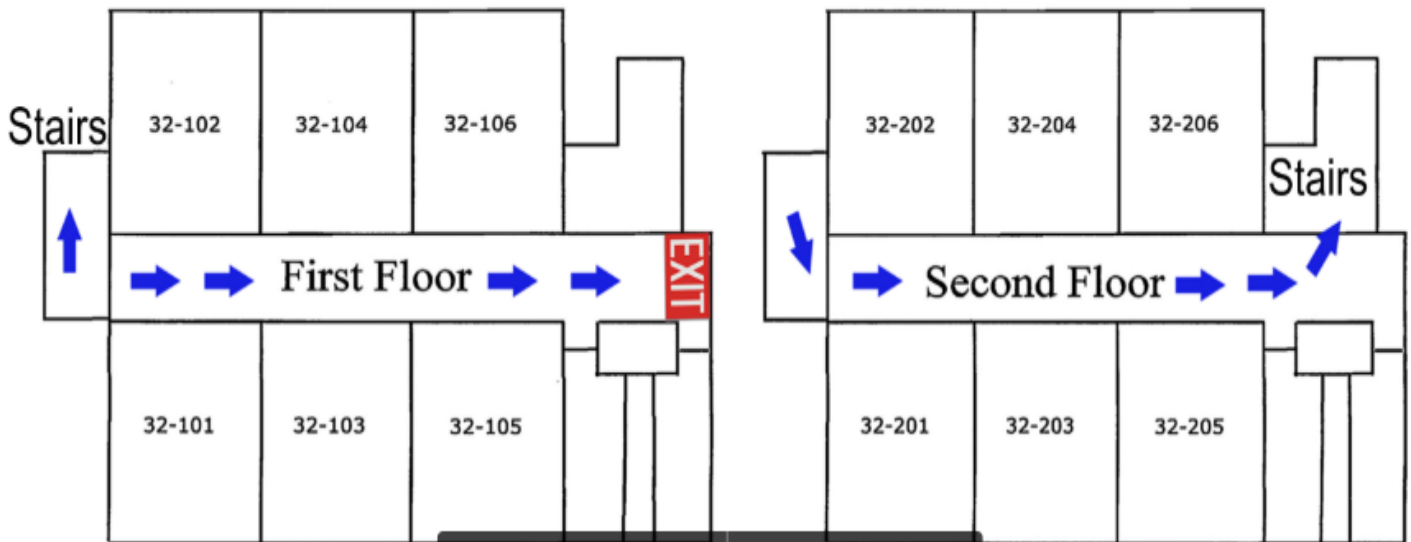

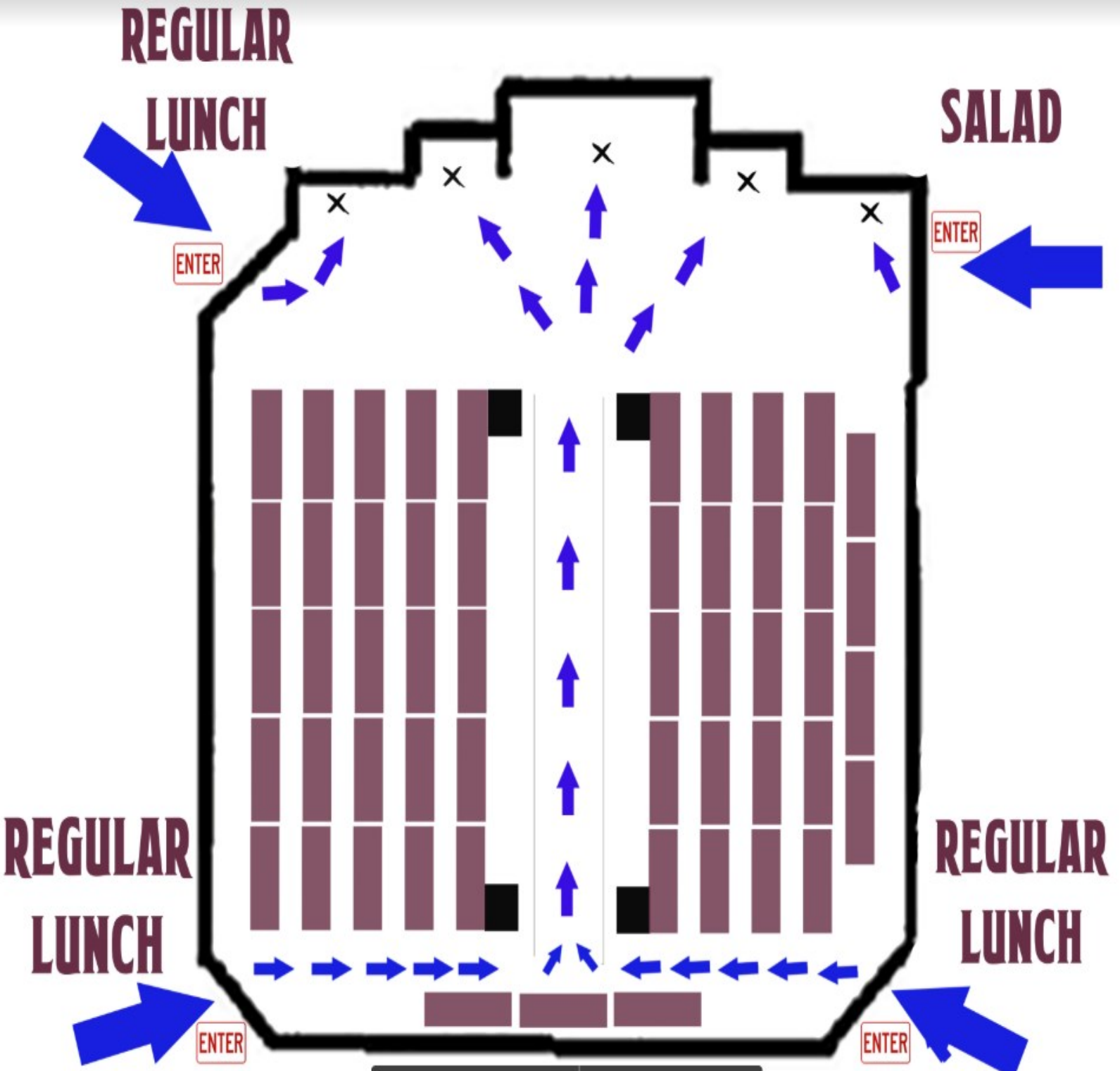

STAY CONNECTED THROUGH FOCUS PARENT PORTAL



Lee County's **FOCUS Parent Portal** provides parents/guardians a real-time view of their child's assignment grades, attendance information, current grade averages in all classes, as well as progress monitoring results.



HOW TO REGISTER

- ▶ <https://lee.focusschoolsoftware.com/focus/>
- ▶ If you are creating an account for the first time, click **CREATE ACCOUNT** at the bottom of the page.
- ▶ Enter the information in all the required fields.
- ▶ You can register with the last four digits of your child's Social Security Number on file with the District to get immediate access to your child's information. **If you do not have or do not wish to provide a Social Security Number leave this section blank.**
- ▶ Once all required information has been entered click **"Add a Student"** button.
- ▶ To add another child, click **"I would like to Add Another Child."** Enter all the information required and click **Add Student.** (Note that this step can be completed as many times as necessary, or later, if needed).
- ▶ Otherwise, click **"I am Finished Adding Students Create My Account."**
- ▶ On the next screen, your child's name will display.
- ▶ If you have provided a Social Security Number, a confirmation message will appear with the username. **Please write the username down for future reference.** Along with the confirmation will be a link to the Parent Portal login screen. **Click the link to log in to the Parent Portal.**
- ▶ If you did not provide the last four digits of your child's Social Security Number, your child's school will receive the request to link the parent account to your child's account. **Once the school has verified the information, you will receive an email in 1-2 business days stating that access has been granted with a link to the Parent Portal login screen.**

***Note in the future you will need to use the username provided, and the password you create to access your portal again.*

- Be sure to get feedback on your college essay from trusted mentors or teachers. Correct your grammar and use a variety of vocabulary.
- Be sure to include letters of recommendation and ask teachers or counselors well in advance of the application deadline.

HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS

Transcript forms are located at the front counter in the Guidance Office.

Fill out one form for each college or university to where you are applying.

If you are under 18 years of age, a parent signature is required for the Guidance Office to release your transcripts.

At the end of your senior year, you will need to request a final transcript to be sent to the college or university you will be attending in the fall. Final transcripts are proof of graduation and final standing in the class.

Transcript forms are located at the front counter in the Guidance office. Transcript cost \$ 1.00 per copy being sent. Forms must be turned into Ms. Williams or Ms. DeLeon.

BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP

The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program establishes lottery-funded scholarships to reward Florida high school graduates for high academic achievement.

STEP 1: Go to www.FloridaStudentFinancialAid.org/SSFAD/bf to find out how to qualify for a Bright Futures Scholarship.

STEP 2: Go to www.FloridaStudentFinancialAid.org and submit a completed, error free Initial Student Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) during your last year of high school, by graduation.

STEP 3: Make the grade, earn the score....and graduate! The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program is created to establish a lottery-funded scholarship program to reward any Florida high school graduate who merits recognition of high academic achievement. The graduate must enroll in a degree program, certificate program, or applied technology program at an eligible Florida public or private postsecondary education institution.

STEP 4: Know your responsibilities....apply, meet the requirements before graduation; throughout your college career. (Requirements are subject to change with each Florida Legislative session.)

SCHOLARSHIPS

The website (sponsored by the Foundation for Lee County Schools) to apply is

<https://flcps.awardspring.com>. Students will create an account, complete the general application, and then as a third step, apply to the Fred & Jean Allegretti Scholarship. They may also apply to any other that they qualify for, including the Suncoast Scholarship, Jeff Sommers Memorial Scholarship, and Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship.

- The Fred & Jean Allegretti Scholarship offers a \$1000 scholarship to 5 Riverdale High School seniors. This scholarship is made possible through the generosity of the Fred & Jean Allegretti Foundation.
- The Suncoast Credit Union Foundation has partnered with the Consortium of Florida Education Foundation to award \$116,000 in student scholarships for graduates of the Class of 2020. Suncoast will award \$2,000 scholarships to 58 high school seniors who demonstrate financial need and strong academic performance across the 21 Florida counties we serve.
- The Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship Fund committee wishes to extend to you this opportunity to apply for the Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship valued at \$1,000 to be awarded in the spring of 2020. Richard Hagy had a passion for educating students and served Lee County Schools for more than 30 years as a teacher, coach, and principal of ALC and Mariner Middle Schools. He was named Principal of the Year and touched the lives of countless students and friends. This is a one-year scholarship, non-renewable, paid directly to the Financial Aid office of the institution the student is attending.

Driver Education: Frequently asked questions

When should I enroll my student in Driver Education?

He/she should have their Learner's Permit, and if possible, be able to supplement the lessons done at school with practice at home. Their experience is not important, they can have zero experience or they could be the predominant driver for the family.

What does my student need to do to acquire their Learner's Permit?

Can my student gain their full license while in Driver Education?

Yes, this is possible. Per DELAP (Driver education licensing assistance program) I am allowed to give the Driver License Test to any student who has met the requirements. Do car insurance companies offer a discount to students who complete a Driver Education course?

Some do and some do not. The best way to find out if yours does is to call them and ask. If they do, to get the discount you will send a copy of your student's transcript after the completion of the course.

Is there a Saturday Driver Education program?

Yes! And if your student doesn't have a free elective period during the school day, it could be the perfect opportunity for him/her. The 2020 fall Saturday Driver Ed course will start September 12th and will fill up fast so don't waste time getting on the list. The sign up list can be found in the Driver Education classroom (9-07).

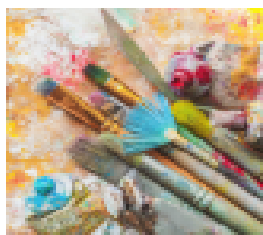
[Hello Pre-IB and IB Art Students!]

In February, NextGeners visited The Collaboratory; a community incubator which brings the community together to share ideas and develop collective solutions to Southwest Florida's most pressing issues. While at the Collaboratory, NextGeners visited the offices of Second Muse and Captains for Clean Water. Jason Teeters and Jonathan Romine of Second Muse conducted a workshop where NextGeners provided solutions for a community challenge. Captain Chris Wittman and Captain Daniel Andrews, Founders of Captains for Clean Water, gave NextGeners a tour of their office and gave a presentation on their journey from fishing captains to political powerhouses as the fight to clean up our local waters on a national level.
