
Staggered Arrival:



- Be sure to get feedback on your college essay from trusted mentors or teachers. Correct your grammar and use a variety of vocabulary.
- Be sure to include letters of recommendation and ask teachers or counselors well in advance of the application deadline.
- Check the class of 2020 Google Classroom for scholarships, FAFSA information and application tips.

- Begin researching post-secondary options such as college or technical schools.

<u>HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS</u>

Transcript forms are located at the front counter in the Guidance Office.

Fill out one form for each college or university to where you are applying.

If you are under 18 years of age, a parent signature is required for the Guidance Office to release your transcripts.

At the end of your senior year, you will need to request a final transcript to be sent to the college or university you will be attending in the fall. Final transcripts are proof of graduation and final standing in the class.

Transcript forms are located at the front counter in the Guidance office. Transcript cost \$1.00 per copy being sent. Forms must be turned into Mrs. Funk or Ms. DeLeon.

BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP

The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program establishes lottery-funded

scholarships to reward Florida high school graduates for high academic achievement.

STEP 1: Go to www.FloridaStudentFinancialAid.org/SSFAD/bf to find out how to qualify for a Bright Futures Scholarship.

STEP 2: Go to www.FloridaStudentFinancialAid.org and submit a completed, error free Initial Student Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) during your last year of high school, by graduation.

STEP 3: Make the grade, earn the score....and graduate! The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program is created to establish a lottery-funded scholarship program to reward any Florida high school graduate who merits recognition of high academic achievement. The graduate must enroll in a degree program, certificate program, or applied technology program at an eligible Florida public or private postsecondary education institution.

STEP 4: Know your responsibilities....apply, meet the requirements before graduation; throughout your college career. (Requirements are subject to change with each Florida Legislative session.)

The website (sponsored by the Foundation for Lee County Schools) to apply is

https://flcps.awardspring.com. Students will create an account, complete the general application, and then as a third step, apply to the Fred & Jean Allegretti Scholarship. They may also apply to any other that they qualify for, including the Suncoast Scholarship, Jeff Sommers Memorial Scholarship, and Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship.

- The Fred & Jean Allegretti Scholarship offers a \$1000 scholarship to 5 Riverdale High School seniors. This scholarship is made possible through the generosity of the Fred & Jean Allegretti Foundation.
- The Suncoast Credit Union Foundation has partnered with the Consortium of Florida Education Foundation to award \$116,000 in student scholarships for graduates of the Class of 2020. Suncoast will award \$2,000 scholarships to 58 high school seniors who demonstrate financial need and strong academic performance across the 21 Florida counties we serve.
- The Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship Fund committee wishes to extend to you this
 opportunity to apply for the Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship valued at \$1,000 to be
 awarded in the spring of 2021. Richard Hagy had a passion for educating students and
 served Lee County Schools for more than 30 years as a teacher, coach, and principal of
 ALC and Mariner Middle Schools. He was named Principal of the Year and touched the
 lives of countless students and friends. This is a one-year scholarship, non-renewable,
 paid directly to the Financial Aid office of the institution the student is attending.





Driver Education: Frequently asked questions

When should I enroll my student in Driver Education?

He/she should have their Learner's Permit, and if possible, be able to supplement the lessons done at school with practice at home. Their experience is not important, they can have zero experience or they could be the predominant driver for the family.

What does my student need to do to acquire their Learner's Permit?

Can my student gain their full license while in Driver Education?

Yes, this is possible. Per DELAP (Driver education licensing assistance program) I am allowed to give the Driver License Test to any student who has met the requirements. <u>Do car insurance companies offer a discount to students who complete a Driver</u> <u>Education course?</u>

Some do and some do not. The best way to find out if yours does is to call them and ask. If they do, to get the discount you will send a copy of your student's transcript after the completion of the course.

Is there a Saturday Driver Education program?

Yes! And if your student doesn't have a free elective period during the school day, it could be the perfect opportunity for him/her. The 2020 fall Saturday Driver Ed course will start September 12th and will fill up fast so don't waist time getting on the list. The sign up list can be found in the Driver Education classroom (9-07).
