BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP

The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program establishes lottery-funded scholarships to reward Florida high school graduates for high academic achievement.

STEP 1: Go to www.FloridaStudentFinancialAid.org/SSFAD/bf to find out how to qualify for a Bright Futures Scholarship.

STEP 2: Go to www.FloridaStudentFinancialAid.org and submit a completed, error free Initial Student Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) during your last year of high school, by graduation.

STEP 3: Make the grade, earn the score....and graduate! The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program is created to establish a lottery-funded scholarship program to reward any Florida high school graduate who merits recognition of high academic achievement. The graduate must enroll in a degree program, certificate program, or applied technology program at an eligible Florida public or private postsecondary education institution.

STEP 4: Know your responsibilities....apply, meet the requirements before graduation; throughout your college career. (Requirements are subject to change with each Florida Legislative session.)

The website (sponsored by the Foundation for Lee County Schools) to apply is

https://flcps.awardspring.com. Students will create an account, complete the general application, and then as a third step, apply to the Fred & Jean Allegretti Scholarship. They may also apply to any other that they qualify for, including the Suncoast Scholarship, Jeff Sommers Memorial Scholarship, and Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship.

- The Fred & Jean Allegretti Scholarship offers a \$1000 scholarship to 5 Riverdale High School seniors. This scholarship is made possible through the generosity of the Fred & Jean Allegretti Foundation.
- The Suncoast Credit Union Foundation has partnered with the Consortium of Florida Education Foundation to award \$116,000 in student scholarships for graduates of the Class of 2020. Suncoast will award \$2,000 scholarships to 58 high school seniors who demonstrate financial need and strong academic performance across the 21 Florida counties we serve.
- The Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship Fund committee wishes to extend to you this opportunity to apply for the Richard Hagy Memorial Scholarship valued at \$1,000 to be awarded in the spring of 2021. Richard Hagy had a passion for educating students and served Lee County Schools for more than 30 years as a teacher, coach, and principal of ALC and Mariner Middle Schools. 



Boys lacrosse poised for a strong 2021 season

Riverdale Boys Lacrosse started its practices for the 2021 season with a strong roster of experienced returning players, a pair of strong freshmen with lots of playing time, and a few brand new players with great potential. The outlook for this year is excellent and the spirits of the team and coaches are high entering the second week of practices.

"We have all the elements in place to have the best season in program history," says 7th year head coach Richard Williamson. "Our senior group includes probably the two best defensemen and the top midfielder in the entire area–probably in the state–and we are gearing up to make a run for the district championship."

Senior captains Graeme Williamson (midfield) and Sean Corbin (defense), along with defender Aidan Rodriguez, are being recruited by top DII NCAA and top-level NAIA teams from around the country, so it's likely that Riverdale's lacrosse brand will become even better known in the future. If past performance is any indication of future success, look for Graeme Williamson to break the single season and career goal scoring records this year. Seniors Cole DeVore and Bailey Moser and sophomore/junior



combo of captain Jake Schmidt and defensive specialist Brett Luna will also form the core of the Raider team. Diego Menjivar converted from midfield to goalie to replace last year's keeper, who transferred to another school. "This year, Diego went from an offensive player filling in at goal to an honest-to-goodness real goalie," coach Williamson commented. "He's got great stick skills and is absolutely fearless when anchoring our solid defense." Logan Bunt returns as one of the top face off midfielders in the state, beating most of the competition in travel play in the fall.

The backbone of every great team is the support it gets from its school and parents. "Riverdale Boys Lacrosse is blessed with spectacular parents, who have built a reputation as the most creative, fun cheering group in the league," says Coach Williamson. "And we are part of a proud, ongoing tradition of great sports at Riverdale. Coach Budmayr, the RHS Athletic Director, has been an invaluable fan and supporter of our program."

Raider Lax's coaching staff returns for 2021. Assistant Coach/Sideline Coordinator Josh Lavy, who played under Coach Williamson at Estero High School, returns for his 7th year with the program. He is joined by 6th year coach Aaron Renfroe and new coach John Brickley. "On game day,



Josh is my right hand man. There is no one better at running the bench and sideline," Coach Williamson says. "Aaron is a US Lacrosse certified coach and his knowledge of all aspects of the game has blossomed over the past year or so." Coach Brickley brings years of basketball and soccer experience to lacrosse, and is able to connect the dots between those sports and is contributing daily on the field.

The team kicks off the 2021 season with an away game against Cypress Lake on February 16th at 67pm and a home game against Estero (7:30pm). Even though they are not in our division anymore, Estero is a huge rivalry and promises to be a ferocious game with great lacrosse. We hope to see many of you there!








BOYS SOCCER




What is the Education Academy?

Driver Education: Frequently asked questions

When should I enroll my student in Driver Education?

He/she should have their Learner's Permit, and if possible, be able to supplement the lessons done at school with practice at home. Their experience is not important, they can have zero experience or they could be the predominant driver for the family.

What does my student need to do to acquire their Learner's Permit?

To find a full list of requirements to acquire a Learner's Permit, visit https://www.flhsmv.gov/driver-licenses-id-cards/licensing-requirements-teens-graduated-driver-license-laws-driving-curfews/

Can my student gain their full license while in Driver Education?

Yes, this is possible. Per DELAP (Driver education licensing assistance program) I am allowed to give the Driver License Test to any student who has met the requirements. <u>Do car insurance companies offer a discount to students who complete a Driver</u> Education course?

Some do and some do not. The best way to find out if yours does is to call them and ask. If they do, to get the discount you will send a copy of your student's transcript after the completion of the course.

Is there a Saturday Driver Education program?

Yes! And if your student doesn't have a free elective period during the school day, it could be the perfect opportunity for him/her. The 2020 fall Saturday Driver Ed course will start September 12th and will fill up fast so don't waist time getting on the list. The sign up list can be found in the Driver Education classroom (9-07).
