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Sign out Procedures

Student Drivers:

To request a release of an RHS student parents should fill out the form on the school website. Once submitted, this form will be automatically sent to the attendance department. Please allow thirty minutes for release from the time of submission.

- No electronic sign out requests will be taken after 10:00 A.M. Daily
- No telephone or email requests are accepted

Students that DO NOT drive:

No student will be signed out without a parent coming in to the attendance office. Students are not permitted to sign-out after 1:00 p.m. per district policy.

Attendance Policy

In an effort to become the highest performing public high school in the state of Florida, students must be in school. Attendance and graduation are an integral part of what we do at FMHS as it goes hand in hand with student achievement. As such we want to make sure that students have every opportunity to achieve their potential through a tradition of excellence. Our attendance policy outlines attendance expectations, privileges, tardies, skipping, and sign-outs.

- At 5 Unexcused Absences/Tardies/Sign Outs (per semester) A school counselor will call the student down for a conference and a call is made home
- At 7+ Unexcused Absences/Tardies/Sign Outs (per semester) Our Assistant Principal calls for a parent conference with guidance. Attendance contract is put in place with administration
- *We hold students accountable when they are in violation of the attendance policy by placing them on an attendance contract at 7+ Unexused Absences/Tardies/Sign-Outs (per semester) and taking away the following privileges: Homecoming Dance Grad Bash Prom Parking Permit(student must remit parking pass until further notice) Walking at Graduation Senior Picnic/Senior Breakfast Extra-Curricular Activities (as deemed by administration)
- *Students will be able to earn these privileges back with consecutive attendance to school, being on time for classes and limited sign outs for 30 days.

Each day student is absent, contract begins over with day 1. Failure to return a signed contract results in the loss of the same privileges above.

- 10 Unexcused Absences/Tardies/Sign-Outs (per semester)-Social worker is notified and parent must attend an attendance review to discuss possible denial of credit.
- 3 Unexcused Tardies to School may equal an absence-as set forth by the Lee County School District Code of Conduct

Parent Portal/E-Forms

All parents/guardians must register in the FOCUS Parent Portal as well as complete student directory information and student health information. These online forms must be completed each year even if no information has changed. The following forms are required per the School District of Lee County: Attendance Policy, Integrity Form, Bully Form, and the Code of Conduct Form.

Teachers Out of Field

Florida State Board Rule 6A-1.0503(3) requires that the School Board must approve all instructional personnel who are assigned to teach out-of-field. In addition, per Florida Statutes 1012.42(2), all parents of students being taught by a teacher who is out-of-field must be notified. This includes teachers who are out-of-field in ESOL.

2021 BACK TO SCHOOL INFORMATION

Dear Parents and Students,

To help clarify some questions that came up specifically regarding tops, we have provided below detailed clarification per the School District Code of Conduct. Please remember that the RHS dress code is an overview and you can access the actual Code of Conduct from the link below.

RHS DRESS CODE EXPECTATIONS The purpose of the Dress Code is to encourage students to focus on the learning process without the distractions of unsuitable dress and grooming. Students shall maintain a clean, orderly appearance at all times.

- 1. Translucent (see-through) or lace tops are not permitted
- 2. Shirts may not be tied up or cut off. Shirts shall be appropriately fastened in accordance with the design of the clothing.
- 3. Midriffs (shirts that show any part of stomach), strapless, tube tops, tank tops (including spaghetti straps), muscle shirts, halters or low- cut clothing are not permitted.
- 4. All shirts or dresses worn under jackets, sweatshirts, or sweaters must adhere to the dress code.
- Shorts, skirts, and dresses must be finger-tip length.
- 6. Pants shall be properly fastened, buttoned, zipped and worn at the natural waistline.
- 7. Shoes (appropriate footwear) shall be worn at all times. All footwear must have back/straps. Bedroom slippers and slides are not permitted.
- 8. The wearing of hats, "doo rags", bandanas, or hoods are not permitted. Hats may be worn at P.E. only.
- 9. Any articles of clothing or jewelry that could likely cause injury are not permitted.
- Symbols that promote the use of alcohol, drugs, tobacco or any other illegal activity are not permitted.
- 11. Clothing with slogans or advertising of a controversial or obscene nature are not permitted.
- 12. Leggings and all spandex/lycra bottoms may be worn as long as no skin or undergarments can be visible (no see through). Pajama pants are not permitted.

If a student is out of dress code, they will sit in a designated area until they are able to acquire proper clothing.

Driver's Education-Frequently asked questions:

When should I enroll my student in Driver Education?

He/she should have their Learner's Permit, and if possible, be able to supplement the lessons done at school with practice at home. Their experience is not important, they can have zero experience or they could be the predominant driver for the family.

What does my student need to do to acquire their Learner's Permit?

Can my student gain their full license while in Driver Education?

Yes, this is possible. Per DELAP (Driver education licensing assistance program) I am allowed to give the Driver License Test to any student who has met the requirements and is enrolled in Driver Education. Some do and some do not. The best way to find out if yours does is to call them and ask. If they do, to get the discount you will send a copy of your student's transcript after the completion of the course.


Are there Saturday or Summer options for Driver Education?


What is the Education Academy?
