RIVERDALE STUDENTS EARN BUSINESS ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

Fourteen Riverdale High School students recently earned Business Achievement Awards from Future Business Leaders of America, with four of them earning a second level of the award. Riverdale will compete next week at the FBLA State Leadership Conference. The 29 members will compete in business events. Ileane Flores, an Adviser Hall of Fame inductee, will accompany the group. Former FBLA president, Ryan White, and Ella Grady (retired science teacher) will also attend.

RIVERDALE WRESTLING

The Raslin' Raiders represented you well this weekend. The team finished in the top five, an improvement from 17th last year. We had 5 state qualifiers and 4 of them placed in the podium. **Cole Schneider** won the Heavyweight State Championship with an escape in the last 3 seconds of the match. **James Monos** was in the state finals dominating his opponent with 15 seconds left and got reversed to his back in a heartbreaking loss. JROTC RAIDER BATTALION NEWS

JROTC Ball: The Raider Battalion is concluding another busy year. The 2015 Lee County JROTC Ball was held on March 7th. Sixty cadets and their guests from Riverdale attended. Over 1200 cadets from the 14 JROTC programs in Lee County were in attendance as well. The event is a cadet lead event, and the night began with the posting of the colors by Dunbar High School, followed by the Missing Man Table Ceremony by the Raider Battalion Staff. Special guests for Riverdale included Mr. John Roszell and his wife and Mr. Tom Wahl and his wife. District guests included school board members, Sheriff Mike Scott, and the District Superintendent Dr. Nancy Graham. Cadets then enjoyed dinner, which started with salad, followed by either steak, chicken, mahi mahi, or vegetarian lasagna, and chocolate cake for dessert. After dinner, the colors were retired, and the formal portion of the ball ended. The final phase of the ball included the presentation of the JROTC, Kings and Queens. Congratulations to our S-1, C/CPT Brianna Piscitelli, Queen and C/2LT Demeterious Joy King. Once the Kings and Queens were presented the floor was opened for dancing until 11P.M. It was a special evening, and we would like to thank everyone who helped make it such a great event.







University of Tampa and University of South Florida:

On the 29th of January, 13 cadets went on a field trip to The University of Tampa and The University of South Florida. Cadets toured both campuses and received briefings from the University Admissions offices and the Army ROTC cadre on scholarship opportunities and admission requirements.

Gulf Coast Drill Meet:

On March 14th the Raider Battalion Drill Teams and Color Guards participated in the Florida Gulf Coast Drill Meet, held at Mariner High School. We sent one female color guard team, two mixed color guard teams, one male unarmed squad, one female unarmed squad and one mixed platoon. The cadets practiced hard for the past few months and they represented Riverdale High School with distinction.

Lee County JROTC Annual Food Drive:

March was the annual JROTC canned food drive and Riverdale JROTC participated along with all of the other Lee County JROTC programs. The combined effort of all Lee county cadets had a significant impact on the ability of the Harry Chapin food bank to provide items to the needy through the spring and on into the summer.

District Marksmanship Competition:

The Raider Marksmanship Team has been practicing since December and has participated in several shoulder to shoulder competitions. Things look good for the District Championship at Island Coast High School. The top 3 teams at that competition will move on to state level competition.

Awards Ceremony:

The annual Lee County JROTC Awards Ceremony will be held at the Harbor Side Events Center on May 7th. This ceremony recognizes those cadets who have done exceptionally well in JROTC throughout the year. Cadets will receive notifications soon after spring break.

Summer Camp:


