46 Riverdale IB Seniors Share Seven-Day Adventure and Service in La Fortuna, Costa Rica. Opting for shovels, work gloves, and a week of exploring the Costa Rican countryside, 46 Riverdale IB seniors left behind their beach towels and typical spring break plans for a week-long exploration and five service projects in La Fortuna, Alajuela, Costa Rica. These 46 seniors along with 6 Riverdale IB teachers, boarded a charter bus pre-

the group

sunrise on Saturday, April 08, 2017 headed toward Miami International Airport to catch their 3-hour flight to San José, Costa Rica.

From there, the students and teachers would be immersed in a week of cultural events, service projects to help the local "Tico" community, and, of course, a lot of fun via the seemingly endless opportunities for Costa Rica eco-

tourism. Early mornings that led into long days of work, fun, experiences, and bonding, kept busy throughout the entire trip. The majority of the meals that private Chef, Don Eric prepared along with his family assistants were all eaten together in the grand pavilion of the Arenal Base Camp Housing. Although the entire trip wasn't centered on just working, the

stu-

dents did participate in five major service projects. The first was to prepare a traditional meal of "pollo con siempre" (a Costa Rican take on rice and beans) which was later served at the local Red Cross where the group also helped to set up and run a Bingo fundraiser to help finance the local clinic which provides health services to the small neighborhood of El Bosque.

Later in the week, the students would grapple with hard labor in projects that included creating a gravel trail for a nature center, constructing bathrooms and digging a septic tank for a local school with very limited resources, demolishing the interior walls of an expanded community center, and laying the cement flooring for a second community center in a different neighborhood.

Despite the hard work, the students seemed to love the experiences and the ability to support the local communities. Their dedication and efforts were beyond impressive and all of them were wonderful ambassadors of Riverdale High School and the United States. Having worked very hard in the initial days of the trip, the final few days were a bit more relaxing as the group zipped through the canopy of the rainforest, trekked deep into the forest for a dip in the pools of the La Fortuna waterfall, had a soak in the thermal hot springs naturally warmed by the underground vein of magma from the Arenal volcano, and splashed their way through the rapids of the Sarapiquí River.


Take me out to the ball game ...






